**Julia Angwin** is a Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist, New York Times bestselling author, and founder of *The Markup*, a nonprofit media organization dedicated to full transparency and investigating how powerful institutions affect our technological lives.

Angwin will speak about her work in accountability journalism, and discuss *The Markup*'s mission to investigate how powerful institutions are using technology to change society. She'll cover a few important investigations and share how *The Markup* has developed custom forensic tools to conduct investigations in pursuit of their mission. Following the talk will be a discussion with Elizabeth Hudson, Dean of the College of Arts, Media, and Design and Professor of Music; Woodrow Hartzog, Professor of Law and Computer Science; and Christo Wilson, Associate Professor, Khoury College of Computer Sciences.
