**Martha Minow** is the 300th Anniversary University Professor at Harvard University where she has taught at Harvard Law School since 1981. An expert in human rights, constitutional law, and advocacy for members of racial and religious minorities and for women, children, and persons with disabilities, she also writes and teaches about media policy, privatization, technology and ethics, military justice, and ethnic and religious conflict.

Professor Minow will present on her current research in a talk entitled “Saving the News: Addressing Digital Disruption and the Future of Journalism,” which will highlight new steps to support and amplify journalism. Following her talk, Professor Minow will engage with three discussants from the Northeastern community: Meredith Clark, Associate Professor in the College of Arts, Media and Design; Brooke Foucault Welles, Associate Professor in the Department of Communication Studies; and James Hackney, Dean and Professor of Law. Finally, there will be a Q&A with attendees.
